


THE CONFESSION OF SIN


Let us confess our sins against God and our neighbor.

Lift up your hearts.


We lift them to the Lord.

Holy and gracious Father: In your infinite love you made us for yourself, and, when we had fallen into sin and become subject to evil and death, you, in your mercy, sent Jesus Christ, your only and eternal Son, to share our human nature, to live and die as one of us, to reconcile us to you, the God and Father of all. He stretched out his arms upon the cross, and offered himself, in obedience to your will, a perfect sacrifice for the whole world.

On the night he was handed over to suffering and death, our Lord Jesus Christ took bread; and when he had given thanks to you, he broke it, and gave it to his disciples, and said,

“Take, eat: This is my Body, which is given for you. Do this for the remembrance of me.”

After supper he took the cup of wine; and when he had given thanks, he gave it to them, and said,

“Drink this, all of you: This is my Blood of the new Covenant, which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Whenever you drink it, do this for the remembrance of me.”

Therefore we proclaim the mystery of faith:

Christ has died. Christ is risen. Christ will come again.

We celebrate the memorial of our redemption, O Father, in this sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving. Recalling his death, resurrection, and ascension, we offer you these gifts.

Sanctify them by your Holy Spirit to be for your people the Body and Blood of your Son, the holy food and drink of new and unending life in him. + Sanctify us also that we may faithfully receive this holy Sacrament, and serve you in unity, constancy, and peace; and at the last day bring us with all your saints into the joy of your eternal kingdom.

All this we ask through your Son Jesus Christ: By him, and with him, and in him, in the unity of the Holy Spirit all honor and glory is yours, Almighty Father, now and for ever. **AMEN.**

And now, as our Savior Christ has taught us, we are bold to say,

Our Father, who art in heaven,
hallowed be thy Name,
thy kingdom come,
thy will be done,

on earth as it is in heaven.

Give us this day our daily bread.



And forgive us our trespasses,

BLESSING +



A Note to Parents

Jesus said, "Let the little children come to me."

This worship book is meant as an aid to help your children experience the beauty and wonder of worship. However, nothing can replace your guidance and example. Sing the hymns, pray, and voice the responses. Children learn how to worship by watching you and the others around them. Please explain the parts of the service, the actions of the priests and other ministers, etc. to your children.

If your children make noise during worship or have trouble sitting still, remember, God put the wiggle in your children. Don't feel like you have to suppress it. If you do need to leave the service for any reason, feel free to do so, but please return.

Remember, the way we welcome children in church directly affects the way they will respond to the Church, to one another, and more importantly to God. Let them know that they are always welcome here.
