Support Those in Need through the Rector's Discretionary Fund

The Rector's Discretionary Account is a pool of money that the St. John's clergy use to help members of St. John's or of the community at large in times of unexpected or emergency need. The account is partially funded through the St. John's budget (\$900 per year), honoraria given to the clergy for funerals or weddings, and loose plate offerings, but this rarely covers the need. Recently, we have received numerous requests for assistance, especially for utilities, and the need has far outstripped the available funds.
